I have retained a loose leaf format so that additional pages can be added or corrected pages can be replaced. So if you have any changes or additions of either text or photographs just mail or e-mail them to me and I will send out supplements probably on an annual basis.

Unfortunately nothing can be done about the page size. In North America "Letter" size is the most common and I could not even find any of the "A4" which is used in Australia. So if you want to make up a presentation book you will have to trim the edges, hope the margins are wide enough.






Married in Hobart, TAS on 11th April, 1884.



Left: The Changing Borders in Europe.


Prussia in blue.

Red lines are 2000 borders.


B = Bagemuhl

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

JOHN CRAIG John's parents were Hugh and Janet Craig (nee. Hyslop). He was born in Dalrymple, Ayr, Scotland on 26 Sep. 1856. At age 7 he was sent out to work in the coal mines so he never went to school and was unable to read or write. When a young man, determined to change that lifestyle, he ran away from home and stowed away on a ship. When found he became one of the crew and worked his passage out. The voyage took him to New York, the Mediterranean, Calcutta and other ports. On arrival in Tasmania he jumped ship, leaving no immigration records, not even the name of the ship. He was engaged on a transport during the Sudan War, probably in the early 1880s. John was the second of eight children in the Craig family. Some of his brothers and sisters were: Jessica (McKnight) in New Zealand; Hugh; Robert (wife Annie) in Australia, living at one time on Bruny Is.; Elizabeth (Lizzie, married Sam Steele) in New Zealand; and Agnes. Elizabeth's only child died on the voyage out and was buried at sea. Records describe John (Jock) as a mill worker, miner, axman and farmer.

MARY CRAIG Mary's parents were Heinrich and Wilhemine (or Wilhelmina) Dunckel of Sawadden, East Prussia. Mary (Maria) was born in 1864 at Sawadden, her sister Augusta was born in 1868, also at Sawadden, and a third sister Agnes was born at Swansea, Tasmania in 1871. **Heinrich Dunckel (or Henry Dunkel)** was born at Sawadden on 29th Feb. 1838 and became a quarryman. **Wilhemine Christina Bergamen** was born on 5th Jan. 1837 at Bagemuhl (or Bagemuehl) in the district of Uckermark, state of Brandenburg, Prussia. She became a midwife. Henry and Wilhemine probably met in Konigsberg (now Kaliningrad) which was the largest city and capital of East Prussia. They were married in 1862 and may have lived in Konigsberg, although the first two children were born in Sawadden, because the large city would have offered better employment opportunities than the small rural communities of Sawadden and Bagemuhl.

Unfortunately the name Sawadden was discontinued in 1939 when there were 67 inhabitants. It does not appear on any modern maps and cannot even be found on any 19th century maps of East Prussia. Only one clue has led to its location. In 1913 a narrow-gauge tourist railway, the Lycker kleinbahn, was built running east from the city of Lyck (now the Polish city of Elk) in the north-east corner of Germany (now Poland). A short southern branch of this line terminated 23km from Lyck at the small settlement of Grenzwacht which was indicated as being previously called Sawadden. Grenzwacht translates as "Border Guard" and was a military outpost on the German-Polish border which ran along the western shore of Rajgrodzkie Lake. In 1945 the name was again changed to Zawady Tworki. The city of Lyck was a rail center and had a direct rail link to Konigsberg, 160km to the north-west on the Baltic Sea. Lyck and Sawadden are situated at the eastern end of the Masurian Lake District which covered much of the south-eastern part of East Prussia. (The northern part is now the Russian oblast Kaliningrad). The lakes are connected by an extensive canal system which was built during the middle of the 19th century and could have been a source of work for quarrymen like Henry Dunckel.

There is one other plausible, though unlikely, explanation for the location of Sawadden. On the Internet there are 10 or more sites reporting weather data in north-east Poland. The area covered is the Masurian Lakes and the name of each location is prefixed with "Sawadden", e.g. Sawadden Lyck. This modern version of Sawadden may be a reincarnation of an earlier Sawadden which was a synonym for the extensive lake area (5000 square miles).

Fortunately Bagemuhl still exists and is located 70 miles NNE of Berlin, between Prenzlow and the Oder River which is the German-Polish border. It is a small town and appears on regional road maps of Germany.

Toward the end of the 1860's Henry, with a family of four, probably realised that the future in Sawadden could be rather bleak and decided to join the millions of Europeans emigrating to the new world to escape the frequent wars, famines and religious conflicts. It was a good choice because Prussia and France were again at war in July, 1870. Thus on June 24 or July 27, 1870 (both dates are listed) the Dunckels departed from Hamburg on the barque *FIGARO* with 130 other immigrants. They arrived in Hobart, Tasmania on October 26, 1870. The 3-4 month voyage was very fast for this type of ship. A barque is a 3-mast sailing vessel with the foremast and mainmast square rigged and the mizzenmast fore-and-aft rigged. (Two interesting notes: a ship *JOHN CRAIG* made an immigrant voyage to Tasmania in 1832; and a Mr Craig was on the *EVELINE* in 1836).

On arrival in Tasmania the family settled in the Swansea district, and in 1871 the third daughter was born. In 1873 a son was stillborn in Hobart. Later Henry tried farming at Sorell Creek but in 1882 moved on to Adventure Bay to work at the coal mine. There he again met Wilhelm Zschachner who with his family had also been passengers on the *FIGARO*. (See under Gwendoline Craig, page 9A). The two families helped form the first permanent settlement at Adventure Bay. Since the mine was closed Henry applied for a selection of land and he had 150 acres surveyed in 1883, part of 200 acres surveyed for Wm. Gordon in 1880. Henry purchased 100 acres for 100 pounds 15 shillings. Much of the land was cleared for dairy cattle and the homestead known as *THE DAIRY* was built. The property was located above Two Tree Point at the mouth of Resolution Creek, the first commercial farm in Adventure Bay.

On April 11, 1884 the Dunckel's eldest daughter Mary married John Craig at the Chalmers Manse (Free Presbyterian Church) in Hobart. Witnesses were Thomas Burns and Augusta Dunckel. John and Mary then lived at Adventure Bay on a piece of the property Henry gave them. Part of their house was a very large hollow tree. They never had a proper house until after several children were born. John worked at the local timber mill.

Probably after Henry's death on 12th April 1896 (Wilhemine died on 6th August 1921) the property was divided between the two daughters Mary and Augusta. The Craigs (Mary and John) received the section south of Resolution Creek and called it *SEA VIEW*. The Hanssons (Augusta and Lars) received the section north of Resolution Creek called *HIGHWOOD*. Agnes Dunckel married Ned Dillon and lived at Alonnah on the channel side of Bruny Island. John and Mary continued farming, shipping small-fruits, apples and dairy products to Hobart. John died on January 9, 1933 and Mary on December 18, 1934. The farm was left to their youngest son Herbert. Both the Dunckels and the Craigs are buried at the Adventure Bay cemetery. For more information see pages 10 and 10A.

John Craig G2. John worked at the timber mill in Adventure Bay. He was a very good axeman and he went to New Zealand where he won the championship. When he returned to Tasmania he married Bessie Gamble and continued wood chopping at shows and regattas. They moved to Moonah and John worked at the Hobart waterfront as a wharfie. He became a member of the Glenorchy Council and president of the Moonah school Parents and Friends Association. John was a strong Labor man and he ran Parliament but failed to get elected.


One night after leaving the wharf at midnight he was walking his bike up the steep hill in Argyle Street, North Hobart when he was struck by a car and severely injured. John died five days later. (Top photo: John)



Phyllis Craig G3. After leaving school Phyllis went into domestic service in the Hobart area. She left Hobart and went to Sydney where she had a son, Noel. She worked at a private school looking after the boarders and Noel attended the school. Phyllis let the family know that she was getting married but no further news was heard.



Phoebe Craig G3. Phoebe trained in dress-making after leaving school and became a first-class dress-maker. She married Cyril Fisher and had one girl, Margaret and two boys, Graeme and Brian. The family lived in the Moonah area. Phoebe spent her last few years in Kingston. She died in 1998. (Middle photo: Phoebe)



Myrtle Craig G3. Myrtle wanted to be a school teacher, so in 3rd year at Hobart High School she got a Studentship. During the next 2 years at high school she had practical experience at schools, eventually going on to Teacher's College, after which she was posted to Snug School until it was burnt down. Later she married Malcolm Smith and helped on the farm at Birches Bay where they grew cherries and apples. After Malcolm died Myrtle bought a house at Redwood Village in Kingston where she enjoys her garden. (Bottom photo: Myrtle)



Agnes Craig G2. Agnes was always known as "Trix". She lived most of her life in Sydney with the Salvation Army. Trix was much loved by her Tasmanian nieces and nephews who looked forward to Christmas for her arrival on the steamship *ZEALANDIA* loaded with presents which she had made by hand during the previous twelve months.



Augusta Craig G2 and Tom Dunn. They were married on 2nd of June, 1923. They lived in Sydney and raised two boys, Leslie and Norman, and one daughter, Ezma.



George Henry Craig G2. George worked at the timber mill in Adventure Bay until WW1 broke out and he joined the army. After the war he was discharged in WA and returned to Bruny to again work at the timber mill. After he married Laurie Jackson he got work at a timber mill in Blackmans Bay. Later he built a house, *CRAIGHILL*, at Dunalley and grew apricots and strawberries. Needing more finance he took a caretaker job with Jones Co. near Bream Creek and then a manager job at Nugent. During WW2 George joined the Army Reserves. Jones Co. gave him a job at their box-making mill at the Hobart wharf. His last job before retiring was as a machinist at Risby Bros in Hobart. George loved to go fishing and would spend hours down at the wharves in Hobart.

George and Laurie had three children: Roy, Eileen and Connie (see Page 3A).

Fredrick Norman Craig G2. Fred was a timber waggon driver in the bush at Adventure Bay. He was the first recruit to enlist from Bruny in WW1, and he left Tasmania on April 8th 1915. He was in the 5th Battalion, Tasmania. He was killed in action in 1918 at Villers- Bretonneux in France, and was awarded a Military Medal which is now on display at the Bruny Island History Room in Alonnah. His Commanding Officer, J.J.Dwyer, told the family that Fred stayed at his post keeping the enemy at bay while others got away. J.J.Dwyer was awarded the VC for the action because only officers were eligible for this award.

Photo about 1960. **Mary Elizabeth Craig G2.** Mary helped at home at Adventure Bay as they had boarders. She met George when he visited his sister Clara and stayed working in the timber industry on Bruny. Mary and George married in 1915. They went to Queensland for their honeymoon and stayed there as George was offered work at Carney's Creek near Boonah about 60km SW of Brisbane, later taking over the management of the family farm at French's Creek. In 1928 the farm was sold. In 1931 they returned to Tasmania for a 3-week holiday but Mary became very ill with Yvonne and had to stay for 3 months. In 1932 the family moved to *VALLEY VIEW* on the Don River, Dawson Valley, QLD. to very primitive conditions. Mary and George were pioneers in the true sense of the word. They are listed in history today held at Wowan museum as being among the earliest settlers in the Bundalba area. By sheer hard manual work they carved a fertile farm from harsh virgin brigalow scrub country. This property remains today as a solitary silent memorial to their efforts, by being, not only a thriving grain growing farm, but the only property within a fifty km. radius not swallowed up by a huge cattle station now known as "Bundalba Downs". The splendid old Queensland high style house complete with surrounding twelve foot verandah, built by Ruth Craig's husband Alec Oliphant in 1938, remains as solid as the day it was built. As the family grew and were unable to be paid wages they moved on. In 1958 the farm was sold. George then worked at Eulogie Park and Mary was the cook there. Later they moved to Rockhampton where Mary cooked at the Lakes Creek Hotel. See page APP-3 for story. Mary died suddenly in April 1963. George remarried and lived to April 1977.



Photo in 1961. **Sylvia Kaden G3.** Sylvia worked as a housemaid and farm hand (which included a lot of cotton picking) for neighbours, bringing all wages home, until George's farm was able to support the family. Then she helped on the property until it was sold. When she was 16 years old her mother developed appendicitis and peritonitis and nearly died. Sylvia took over the household, and the baby Yvonne, until her mother recovered. After the farm was sold she went to Rockhampton and did housework for a doctor. Then she moved to Mackay, doing full time ministry for Jehovah's Witnesses. She met John Fahey and they were married. Sylvia and John moved around Queensland towns witnessing and finally settled in Dubbo, N.S.W. Sylvia died in January 1999.



Wilfred (Bill) Kaden G3. Bill helped to establish the farm for some years but then left to work on various jobs, cane-cutting, in a sawmill and other places. He joined the R.A.A.F. in 1939 and remained there until the end of W.W.2. He married Doris Firth during the war years. After the war he worked on a small farm then joined the P.M.G. as a linesman, becoming a Supervising Officer. He had two children, Russel and Dale. Bill moved to Machins Beach outside Cairns, where he lived until he died in March 1989.



Laurel Kaden G3. Laurel worked on the farm for several years. In 1939 she went to Brisbane where she did her apprenticeship in tailoring and dressmaking. She returned to Wowan and started her own business and continued it after marrying John Tengbom in 1946. John worked on the railways and later Laurel became a Station Mistress at Dululu until it was closed down. She did a lot of craft work, such as flower making and putting shells on vases, boxes and other items. She also learned how to paint pictures. Laurel and John loved playing lawn bowls. John loved fishing and while he was fishing Laurel would collect shells. They always lived in Queensland.



Roy Kaden G3. Roy left home in 1939, aged 13 years, and worked on properties and wherever he could obtain work. When he turned 18 in 1943 he joined the R.A.A.F. and earned his wings. During training at Shepparton, Victoria he was injured in a plane accident and was also injured in another plane crash while overseas. After the war he joined the railways. Roy enjoyed horse racing, but more so greyhound racing. He owned two greyhounds and had several successes in the races. Roy died in 1967 aged 42 after being diagnosed, but being unsuccessfully treated, with cancer.

Ruth Wilheminia Craig G2. Ruth was born at Adventure Bay, Bruny Island and went to Maroon, Queensland when she was about 16 to look after her sister Mary who was ill. There she met and married David James Alexander Oliphant in 1918.

Hazel Cotterill G3. On completing her nursing qualifications, Hazel joined the Australian Army and was with the 2nd/6th Nursing section in the army. She trained in the Atherton Tablelands prior to serving in North Borneo towards the end of the war. Hazel returned to Australia to marry Bruce Cotterill and they moved to Sydney where they raised Ann, Sue, David and John. In later years Hazel returned to nursing, working with a group of fine ladies who devoted their time to the "Children of Allawah" in Sydney. After 25 years of total dedication to the Children of Allawah, Hazel was awarded the "Order of Australia Medal" in 1989. She earned this by sheer hard work with disabled children and for the counselling and guidance she gave to the parents of these children. Herbert then worked as a builder's labourer. He always had a lovely flower and vegetable garden and he loved to go fishing.


Allan Craig G3. After leaving school Allan worked as a mechanic for 14 years and then worked as a builder. Like his father he loves gardening and fishing. He married Gloria in 1964 and they have 3 children.

Judith Craig G3. Judith did secretarial work, first with Port Huon Fruit Juices and later with the Medical Benefit Fund. She married Barry Hooker in 1964 and they moved to Queensland. After many transfers, including to New Guinea, they returned to Queensland. They now live in Rockhampton and Judith works as a teacher's aid.



Grace Aneroy Craig G2. Before marrying Bill Peterson in 1921 Grace worked in Hobart with her cousin Dorrie Hansson as nursemaids and maids. This training taught her to be exact and correct in everything, a standard she maintained all her life. Her marriage to Bill was at her home in Adventure Bay. It was a double wedding, with her sister Dorothy marrying Harry Debnam. These two families maintained a very close relationship, living in Moonah TAS, always less than a block apart even with several moves by each family. Bill and Grace lived in Westerway for a short period before the family moved to Moonah. During the depression Bill ran cows to sell milk together with vegetables and flowers to avoid going on the "Dole". Later Bill worked at the Zinc Works at Risdon until he retired. The family was very active in the Moonah Baptist Church. Grace was an excellent cook but had very poor health and spent many long periods in hospital.

He became Supervisor in Charge in 1980 and retired in 1986 to care for his wife Beryl who suffers from multiple Sclerosis. They live in Glenorchy, TAS.



Elizabeth Joy Peterson G3. After completing High School and Business College Joy went to work in an insurance company doing accounting. During this time she met and married Geoff King in 1951 and had her only child, Susanne. Later she wanted a change of work and took a position at the Cadbury factory in Claremont as secretary to the Chief Chemist where she remained for over 17 years until she sustained a heart attack and retired. They first lived at Simpsons Bay until Miriam was born, having lost the first child Stanley when only two days old. The family moved to Moonah, a suburb of Hobart, where Harry set up a plumbing business. Adrian was born in Hobart in 1925 soon after the move. The family members were very active in the Moonah Baptist Church. Dorrie took every opportunity to return to Adventure Bay so the children got to know their grandparents and to enjoy the wonders of the farm, such as milking the cows, feeding the calves, pigs and chickens, picking raspberries and apples, and even carrying water from Resolution Creek. Better still was playing on the beach, swimming, and fishing in the boat with Uncle Herbert. Miriam was an excellent scholar but she contacted diphtheria which left her with a weak heart and she died at age 16. Dorrie died in 1985 at age 85.

Adrian Harry Debnam G3. Adrian was the only surviving child in the family. After high school he attended the University of Tasmania in 1943-47 and obtained a B.Sc. in Chemistry. In 1945 he was in the RAAF as an aircrew trainee. For the next ten years he was an exploration geochemist with the Bureau of Mineral Resources in Canberra. His specialty was the design and operation of field and mobile laboratories in mineral exploration areas in the NT and QLD. In 1951 a leave of absence was spent travelling in Europe and working in the UK and in 1956


visits were made to the USA, Canada and the UK investigating the latest methods of geochemical prospecting. During 1959-60 Adrian studied at the Royal School of Mines in London with field work in Central and East Africa, and received a PhD. In 1961 he moved to Canada on a Post-Doctorate Fellowship at the Geological Survey in Ottawa to develop methods for finding oil and gas using geochemistry. On a trip across the Pacific on the *ORIANA* in 1962 (it was the maiden voyage and it collided with a US aircraft carrier in dense fog off Long Beach, California) Adrian met Audrey and they were married in Brisbane in 1963. They returned to Canada later in 1963 and after a brief period in Toronto moved to Oakville, a community just west of Toronto on Lake Ontario, where they still live. After a short period as a consultant Adrian joined a chemical testing laboratory in Toronto to set up a geochemical division to serve the Canadian mining industry. He remained there until he retired from management in 1990. The family expanded to five between 1966 and 1970 with the addition of three girls and attended the Calvary Baptist Church in Oakville. Adrian kept very busy in retirement and particularly enjoyed editing this Family Tree with the invaluable help of other family members.





Gladys Henrietta Craig G2. Glad helped on the farm until she met and married Fred Jackson in 1926. They lived on their farm *MAVISTA* at Adventuer Bay. During the depression they moved to Lunawanna where Fred worked on the Pine Plantation and he rode to the farm and worked it on weekends. They moved back to *MAVISTA* in 1939 before the start of WW2. Together they planted a small fruit farm. The *MAVISTA* homestead was burnt down in the 1940 bush fires. In 1950 they sold the farm and moved to Hobart when the children needed to be in town for schooling. Buying houses then renovating and selling them kept them going, and growing flowers and vegetables also helped. Glad died in 1990.

Muriel Jackson G3. Muriel helped on the farm during the war as Fred was often away in the V.D.C. army. Later she worked at the shop in Adventure Bay and then went to Hobart working in boarding houses. She met Geoff Scott while he was in Hobart to get his discharge from the army. They were married in 1948 and moved to King Island in Bass Strait to run a dairy farm. They had two children, Dianne and Wayne. In 2001 they sold the farm and moved into the township of Currie on King Island.



Tennyson Jackson G3. Tennyson was about one year old when infantile paralysis (polio) struck, leaving him crippled in one leg. He did an apprenticeship for aircraft mechanic and worked for Australian National Airlines at the Cambridge airport. He loved riding his motor-cycle. Tennyson went to the Croydon Bible College hoping to do missionary work but was unable to because of the polio. He married Daphne Allen in 1956 and they had four daughters and one son who died in infancy. Having farming in his blood Tennyson bought a farm at Port Arthur, TAS but unfortunately his leg let him down again so he bought a service station and added a room for a take-away shop and groceries. Later they moved back to Hobart where Tennyson worked with the RACT until he retired, living at Risdon. Tennyson died in 1999.



Avril Jackson G3. After leaving commercial school Avril worked in a furniture store as cashier for over seven years and then took up nursing at the Royal Hobart Hospital. She met Doug Madden and they were married in 1956. Although Avril was kept busy raising five children she always had an open house for visitors and they often accommodated visiting missionaries. Doug worked in radiotherapy treating cancer patients until his hearing deteriorated. He then worked at the University of Tasmania in electronics. After retirement they sold their home in Sandy Bay and moved to a home in Lindisfarne overlooking the Derwent River with delightful views of Hobart and Mount Wellington.

Jim Jackson G3. Jim was an outdoors person, he worked with Tennyson at a service station and also had a milk run, delivering milk around the suburbs starting at 4am. He married Margaret Supplice in 1962 but years later they were divorced. Jim also worked for a furniture removalist and was transferred to Melbourne. However an accident with a piano caused cancer to develop so he returned to Hobart where he married Kate Young shortly before his death in 1976.



Alison Jackson G3. Alison had several jobs before getting a position as a junior teacher for a year and then going on to Teacher Training College in Launceston TAS. Her first appointment was at Sorell for two years after which she did two years at Bible College in Melbourne VIC. Alison then returned to Hobart where she taught at the Calvin Christian School when it opened. In 1962 she married Malcolm Carins. They had a dairy farm at Winaleah TAS where they raised the family of one boy and three girls. They sold the farm in 1998 and built a home overlooking the Tamar River at Hillwood. Alison loves her large flower garden and enjoys giving away slips and plants.

Gwendoline Joyce Craig G2. Gwen was an adopted daughter and the last of the seventeen Craig children. Gwen lived at the original Craig homestead with her brother Herbert until she married Charlie Nichols in 1938 and moved to the Mavista farm with her sister Glad. In 1940 the Mavista residence was destroyed in a bush fire and Gwen and Charlie lost all their possessions. They then moved into the house of Charlie's grandparents, Arch and Maria Zschachner at Coal Point. This house is still standing and was probably built by Charlie's great-grandfather, William Zschachner a coal miner who was the first settler in Adventure Bay, arriving in 1876. Gwen lived all her life on Bruny, helping with general farming and fruit picking. She enjoyed cooking and sewing and was kept busy raising seven children. She passed away at home in Adventure Bay in 1992. Charlie worked at the timber mill in Adventure Bay until 1966, then with the Forestry Department and later with HEC. His prowess in cricket was legendary both as a batsman and a fast bowler and he was an excellent woodchopper. He died in 2001.

Sonia Geraldine Nichols G3. Sonia went to school on Bruny Island, then to Business College in Hobart. In 1956 she started nurses' training at St. John's Private Hospital, worked at Queen Alexandra Maternity Hospital, and married Athol Stephens. They had 3 children: Deborah, a baby girl who died at birth, and Nicholas. In 1961 they moved to Burnie for about eighteen months, where Sonia worked at the Burnie Hospital. Returning to Hobart, she worked at St. Helen's Private Hospital part-time and on call for several Aged Care Nursing Homes. For a change she had a small take-away hop next door to the Hobart City Hall. In 1974 she went to work at the Royal Hobart Hospital, working on several different wards -- Casualty, Theatre Recovery Room and Specialists' Clinics. 30 years on and she is still working at the R.H.H. in the Eye Clinic. Sonia is divorced and lives in Glenorchy, TAS.

Miriam Gay Nichols G3. Miriam went to school at Adventure Bay and Alonnah on Bruny then Zercho's Business College in Hobart in 1957. She took a position of records clerk at MBF AUST in 1958. Miriam married John Garrett in 1961 and they had two children, Kim and Steven. She also worked at Cadbury Schweppes, at ACI Glass and at a solicitor's office in Hobart. After a three month overseas holiday with John in 1977 Miriam returned to Cadbury Schweppes until 1980 when she joined the Marine Board of Hobart as a receptionist/ computer operator and retired in 1986. Miriam has lived in Berriedale for 38 years, played lawn bowls at the Claremont Bowls Club and was President of the Womens Bowls Club in 2001-2003. She has been a keen member of the Claremont Garden Club for over 30 years and honoured as a life member.

Graeme Charles Nichols G3. Also known as **Ginger**, Graeme attended the Alonnah Area school and then worked for a short time at Hamilton Wines Hobart. In 1964 he joined the RAAF as a boiler maker and reclassified in 1974 to steward. Graeme was involved in a very bad car accident in NSW in 1973 and spent many months in hospital recovering. He served 1+ terms in Vietnam as a steward during the Vietnam War. Graeme retired in 1986 to live in Adventure Bay where he purchased the home built by his late uncle Harry Debnam and is now living in a newly built house next door.

Douglas Gary Herbert Nichols G3. Also known as **Horse**, Douglas attended the Alonnah Area school. He joined the RAN, trained as a cook and served over 8 years. He then worked in Hobart as a cook at the Police Academy. In 1976 Douglas married Lynette Clark and they had one son, Troy Douglas Gerald James. To continue on navy service Douglas joined the Lighthouse Service, trained at the Eddystone lighthouse and was stationed at the Tasman lighthouse with his family for a year before Lynette's ill health forced them to return to Hobart. He later separated from his wife and lived at Adventure Bay with his sister Derolyn for eleven years. In 1993 Douglas suffered an aneurysm and passed away at home on Bruny Island.

Derolyn Gloria Nichols G3. Derry went to the Alonnah Area school until she was 15 years of age. With the benefit of self taught sewing skills she was employed at Scott's International Men's Wear in Hobart for three years. In 1969 Derolyn married Ian Kaden of Lunawanna where they lived and raised three children; Andrew, Jacqueline and Karina. Derolyn and Ian later separated and Derry moved to Adventure Bay with the children. She remarried in 1993 to Antony Wessing and now lives next door to (actually behind) the Bligh Museum of Pacific Exploration in the Adventure Bay village. The Wessings are currently owner operators of the South Bruny school bus service.

Sandra Germaine Nichols G3. Sandie attended the Alonnah Area school, the Taroona High school and the Rosetta High school. She then worked in various positions in the Purity supermarket in Sandy Bay and at the IXL factory in Hobart for two years. Sandra then went to Sydney and worked at Woolworths in Double Bay for seven years, managed a Safeway store in Rose Bay and a newsagency in Carlton. In 1977 Sandra married Gary Walton in Sydney. They had one daughter Jody-Elize, but later separated and Sandra returned to Tasmania. She remarried in 1982 to Michael Hill and had a son Hayden. They separated and Sandra now works at the Coles supermarket in Glenorchy and lives in Glenorchy.



Kerry Glenn Nichols G3. Also known as **Boxer**, Kerry attended the Alonnah Area school and was a boarding student at the Newtown High school. When he was seventeen Kerry was involved in a shooting accident and was critically ill in the Royal Hobart Hospital. During a long convalescence he was only able to perform light duties. He took odd jobs before joining Telecom Australia where he worked in various positions for thirteen years. At retirement he was a Telstra telephone installer. In 1977 Kerry married Valerie Clark, a sister of Douglas's wife Lynette. They had two children, Sharon and Ben. Later they were divorced. Kerry retired early due to ill health and now lives at Adventure Bay.

Family visitors can find Derolyn Wessing's residence behind the Bligh Museum of Pacific Exploration in the village, Kerry is at 11 Lockley's Road and Graeme is on the Main Road near Quiet Corner. They are the last Craig descendants still on Bruny (in 2003).

ADVENTURE BAY BRUNY ISLAND

When selecting the *HIGHWOOD* property at Two Tree Point the Dunckels may not have realised that they were settling on land that overlooked one of the most historic locations in all Australia. The bay was first approached by the explorer Abel Tasman on 29.11.1642 but before he could anchor a strong gale forced him out to sea. His ships were *Heemskerk* and *Zeehaan*. The next visit was in 1773 by Tobias Furneau in *Adventure*. Furneau had left England in 1772 with James Cook in *Resolution* but they lost contact in a storm off New Zealand so he then followed Tasman's charts to Van Diemen's Land and the bay which he named Adventure Bay. Cook did not return until his third voyage in *Resolution* and *Discovery* when on 26.01.1777 he anchored in Adventure Bay (he did not know it was Australia Day). William Bligh was the sailing master on *Resolution*. Bligh returned on *Bounty* in 1788 and again on *Providence* in 1792 when he had Matthew Flinders as his midshipman. In 1793 Bruni D'Entrecasteaux on *Recherche* and *L'Esperance* surveyed the Bay and also found that Bruny was actually an island. Nicholas Baudin made a visit in 1802.

Two Tree Point was mentioned in the journals of most of the early explorers. A sketch by Lieut. George Tobin in 1792 shows these two trees much as they are today.


Resolution Creek appeared on the charts of Furneaux and Cook as Watering Place and it was Bligh who first referred to it as *Resolution* Creek in 1788. The creek was favoured by the explorers because it continued to flow even during dry periods.

The Adventure Bay village is at the southern end of the bay and is well signed to indicate points of interest such as cairns, memorials and the museum.


So take the ferry to Bruny and spend some time with your ancestors. On the next bluff past Cole Point visit the cemetery and find the graves of the Dunckels and the Craigs. Then drive down a steep hill and cross a bridge. The next hill is Two Tree Point with *HIGHWOOD* on the right. Down a short hill, cross *Resolution* Creek and stop at the cairn. This is our special part of the Bay. On the right is *SEA VIEW*. The old homestead is gone. Imagine you can smell the fresh bread baked by Mary and her girls for the mill hands using their large brick oven. Step onto the beach and leave your footprints in the sand. Contemplate on what life was like at your ancestral home more than 100 years ago. Your footsteps may disappear but not the memories.







about 3 miles to a neighbour who owned a car. The neighbour came and took Mum the 13 miles into the hospital. I was only 5 months old and Mum had to wean me, and Sylvia at 16 years old became my carer until Mum was able. Not only did Mum have appendicitis but the appendix had burst and she nearly died. She had severe anemia and the only cure was to eat raw liver sandwiches which she tolerated until she was well. We were very lucky to still have Mum with us.

Mum and Dad were indeed true pioneers. Dad was offered a choice of some blocks in the Bundalba area near Wowan in Central Qld. He chose blocks 16 and 17 which were a good sized property to set up a dairy farm. The family moved to the property in April 1932 after he had been travelling backwards and forwards from his sister's and her family's place about 9 miles away, each day to prepare the house for his own family in which to live.

It was not flash as it was only bag walls inside the house dividing the rooms and one section outside was only bag too (this section was later replaced with corrugated iron), the rest of the outside walls were kerosene tins cut and flattened out. The roof was corrugated iron and this was very useful for catching rainwater to run into the tanks. We only had one tank until the new house was built. There was no ceiling in the house and when it rained it was loud on the roof. The carpet snakes used the rafters in the ceiling to curl up and sleep. No one was ever harmed by one. The windows were only made of corrugated iron and a forked piece of timber was used to prop them open. Inside was quite dark when we had to shut the windows and in winter cold breezes would sneak in through any small space they found. In those days we had really cold winters, not like now when they seem warmer except for an occasional day or two.

Roy, Les and I had about 7 miles to go to school. At first Roy would double me on his bicycle or behind the saddle on a horse until Dad bought me a pony suitable for me to ride. Les and I always rode our horses.

It was brigalow country and took a lot of hard work to clear. All the older children gave a hand to clear it. When there was enough cleared land for the start of a dairy farm the older children, Sylvia and Bill, went out to work. Laurel went out later and obtained work in a cafe in Wowan for some time before going to Brisbane to learn dressmaking.

We had only been in the house about 4 months when Mum became very ill with appendicitis. My brother rode a horse

A QUEENSLAND STORY (Continued)

Many of our meals consisted of kangaroo meat, scrub turkey, plain turkey (when they were around), and as well Mum raised turkeys, chickens and ducks which were all very tasty the way Mum cooked them. In the beginning Mum also had guinea fowl, but they always wandered down the paddock to lay their eggs so they eventually received the axe. When any bull calves were born they were slaughtered by Dad as bulls do not produce milk. Very occasionally a cow would be killed (probably because it was not a good milker), the neighbours would come and help and the meat would be shared. There were times too when Dad would kill a pig. He had built a smoke house and would smoke his own bacon, ham and sausages. I guess he learnt the trade from either his father or some other German family. It was very good eating.

When Dad needed help he hired a labourer for a while, but that was after he was able to pay a wage. Sylvia worked on properties around the area until the farm was on its feet a bit. When each of the children grew old enough to help we were given jobs to do. Les and I were nearly late for school every day as we had to milk 4 cows before we went down the paddock to catch our horse for school, have breakfast, get changed and take the cows down the paddock on our way. Then we would bring them in for milking on our way home. When Dad started cultivating crops we would be out there on weekends chipping weeds out of the rows of grain and cotton. When crops grew we would help with the harvest. Plowing was done with horses and a small plough at first. Later Dad bought a disc plough with 4 blades to do more rows at one time. Then later still he bought a tractor. But those additions were many years after settlement on the land. Sometime in the 1940s he also started a vegetable garden. Then he bought a utility to commence a vegetable run round the farms in the area. When that became successful he bought a truck and was able to do longer runs. The vegetables were grown in the winter and rockmelons and watermelons in the summer.

I enjoyed the country life and could have easily have stayed on the farm except for Dad's attitude. He was a hard man to live with. Mum was offered help to leave him at one stage, but Mum was not that kind of person and remained faithful to her commitment of marriage. Deep down I think she really loved him as I would often see her with tears in her eyes and I knew she was hurting, but I was too young to know how to comfort her. In later years Mum became a Jehovah's Witness and through going to assemblies and meetings they later had a much better relationship. Dad's attitude never changed but at least they were in a better relationship.

Yvonne Kaden G3. Yvonne went to boarding school for 4 1/2 years then worked in an office in Wowan until she received a government position as stenographer in the Railway Department in Rockhampton. In 1950 her father needed help on the farm during the drought so Yvonne returned home. She later obtained work with the Commonwealth Government in offices, also in Rockhampton. Yvonne married Ray Davidson and they had 8 children. They later moved to Emerald. Yvonne loved cooking and caring for her family and others. Yvonne and Ray presented marriage preparation courses to couples intending to be married. (Note: see family photo in The Gallery).



Leslie Kaden G3. Les, in nature and looks, is much like his father. He spent a year at boarding school after which he left home at the age of 15. After working on some of the local farms he obtained a job in the railway gang as a nipper doing odd jobs and boiling the billy for the railway gang. He married Joan Beutel on 18th February 1956. Les bought the farm from his father, but during a drought the water for irrigation turned salty and he could not make a living for his family so he sold it and moved to Rockhampton where he rejoined the railway in the bridge gang. In 1967 Les was transferred from Ipswich to Tully, N. Queensland, as 2nd class carpenter. In 1969 he became leading hand bridge carpenter. In 1972 he left the railway and joined the main roads as form setter building concrete bridges and culverts. In 1978 he got a job at Weipa Bauxite Mine as bulk loader operator loading ships. In 1990 Les left the mine and started his own mowing and gardening business from which he retired in 2002 aged 67. Les and Joan were divorced and he took a new partner, Merlene. They married in March 2004. From the time Les was 3 years old he was singing some of the hillbilly songs of the day. When he was older he taught himself to play the guitar and spent time singing in hotels and at friendly parties. Les went on a tour around part of Australia and tried to visit family members but was not always successful as some were not home. While travelling he would sit in the annex of his van and play and sing and people would come and listen to him. He really enjoyed singing.



1961 Photo. David Kaden G3. David worked hard on the farm from infancy to when it was sold in 1958. Apart from a few months, he never attended a regular school, but received all education via correspondence school supervised at home by Sylvia. Lessons were done mostly by kerosene lamp at night, only after the day's work had been completed. The only exceptions were oral learning that could be combined with work. After moving to Rockhampton he obtained employment as truck driver, and spare parts assistant. David moved to Maryborough where he married and joined the Post Office. After 13 years in all capacities he left to manage a sewing shop, after which he joined TAFE College, occupying several positions during his eleven years. When his youngest son attended university David moved to Toowoomba, being employed at K.R.Darling Downs. Following a serious back injury he retired to Hervey Bay.

Due to his own struggle for education David has been deeply involved in both self and voluntary educational programs. Like both Sylvia and Mary, he became one of Jehovah's Witnesses and enjoys doing voluntary work and helping others. Since retirement he and his wife spend much time encouraging the elderly and ill. David also still enjoys the occasional camping, fishing or crabbing trips with his family.

Mary's Cooking

One common trait attributed to the Craig girls was their excellent cooking abilities, probably inherited from their mother Mary (Gen.1). In fact one of them, Mary (Gen.2), may have caused a cooking revolution. David submitted the following entertaining story.

When working at the Lakes Creek Hotel Mary became concerned about the huge number of workers of the massive Lakes Creek Meat Works, situated opposite the hotel, who either indulged in a liquid lunch or a daily meat pie from the mobile vendor. After much persuasion the publican allowed Mary a week's trial to prepare and offer wholesome home cooked meals at cost price to be eaten within the hotel at lunchtime. A notice board was placed outside to that effect and within three days they became so rushed off their feet that extra staff had to be found in order to cope with the lunch rush. By the end of the second week other hotels in the Rockhampton area were following suit to tap into this lucrative market. As far as David can ascertain his mother Mary (Gen.2) was the first in Australia to serve counter lunches in hotels. They are now essential and major draw-cards in that industry in this modern day.



WRAAF during the war). He flew for the Governor General Sir William McKell. In 1951 Clyde joined Qantas as a navigator and worked for them based in Sydney, London and Mexico until 1976. He then lived in New Guinea as Chief Navigator for Air Niugini until he retired. Clyde moved to Clunes and then to Coffs Harbour where he now (2005) lives.

David Clyde Oliphant G3. Clyde was born at Boonah, Queensland on March 3rd, 1922. After leaving school he worked as a blacksmith at an engineering firm. He joined the RAAF in 1940 and after training became a navigator on Blenheim 4's. He flew in the Middle East, Kenya, Egypt and Burma and was severely injured when his plane was shot down during reconnaissance over Burma in August 1942. He was lucky to survive and spent a year in hospital in Lucknow, India. He narrowly missed having both an arm and a leg amputated.

When back in Australia after the war Clyde was based in Darwin flying Liberators bringing back prisoners of war. He spent two years in the air force after the war at Amberley, Archerfield and at Schofield where he met Jeanette Corpe (who had been a wireless operator in the









